### **BIBLE PASSAGE** Exodus 14:13-14

Moses answered the people, "Do not be afraid. Stand firm and you will see the deliverance the LORD will bring you today. The Egyptians you see today you will never see again. The LORD will fight for you; you need only to be still."

### **BIBLE SUMMARY**

In the "Adventures in the Proof of God's Authority," God shows Moses and the Israelites they can trust and obey Him. He offers them many signs of His power and good intentions so that they will follow Moses into the promised land and be God's people.



# UNIT TEACHER PREP

### **LESSON 1 RESPECTING GOD (EXODUS 3:1–12)**

LESSON TARGET; Know that God called Moses from a burning bush to lead His people out of slavery.

**LESSON SETTING:** As the narrative opens, Egypt has enslaved the Israelites. Pharaoh (the title of the Egyptian ruler) has ordered the midwives to kill all male Israelite babies. This was to keep them from multiplying so much that they could rebel against their masters. God calls Moses to lead the people out of Egypt. We see that when God calls, God provides.

#### **LESSON 2** HEARING GOD (EXODUS 4:1–17)

**LESSON TARGET:** Understand that God gave Moses the ability to show signs so the Israelites would know God sent him.

LESSON SETTING: God told Moses to do something dangerous: lead His people out of Egypt. The people's lives would be at stake, so they needed proof that God was indeed sending Moses to deliver them. Therefore, God gave Moses signs to show them.

### **LESSON 3** FOLLOWING GOD (EXODUS 5:1-21)

**LESSON TARGET:** Understand that Pharaoh refused Moses' request.

**LESSON SETTING:** Moses and the Israelites likely thought that the trek out of Egypt would be easy. But they were wrong. When Moses asked Pharaoh to let the people come with him to the desert to worship God, Pharaoh refused and increased the people's workload. They not only had to make the same quota of bricks, but they also had to gather the straw they needed to make the bricks. As a result, the Israelites doubted God sent Moses. Moses himself was confused. But difficulties do not mean God is not with us.

### **LESSON 4**

### **BELIEVING GOD (EXODUS 7:14-24)**

LESSON TARGET: Understand that God sent a plague of blood as a sign He was the true God.

LESSON SETTING: Ten plagues in all demonstrated to the Egyptians and the Israelites that God was the true God. Most of the plagues showed that God was more powerful than the gods the Egyptians worshiped. For example, the Egyptians believed the Nile was the sacred bloodstream of the god Osiris, yet Moses' God turned it into blood. This taught the Israelites that they should not worship any god but the one true God.



### **Exodus 3:1-12** Moses and the burning bush. One day while Moses was out watching over his family's sheep, he saw a most unusual sight! He saw a bush that was

on fire but not burning up. So Moses went over to see this strange sight. When he got closer, a voice from the bush called his name! "Moses! Moses!" He realized the voice was God's voice! Moses answered God, saying, "Here I am." God told Moses to take his shoes off because he was standing on holy ground. Then God told Moses through the burning bush that He had heard the cries of His beloved people in Egypt. The Egyptians had made God's chosen people their slaves and were treating them very poorly.

God then told Moses he had been chosen to go to Egypt to deliver this message from God: "Let my people go!" Moses worried about this and wondered if maybe there was a younger, more powerful, and even better spoken person who could go instead of him. But God had a perfect plan for Moses that would prevent him from failing. God had chosen Moses and knew he was the best man for the job, and He told Moses He would be with him throughout the whole journey. Though this was a big challenge for Moses, he did know that he would have God on his side when he went to ask Pharaoh to let the Israelites leave Egypt.





**Exodus 4:1-17** Moses receives signs and power. Have you ever had doubts? Moses worried that the Israelites would not believe God sent him to take them out of Egypt. He also lacked confidence to speak to Pharaoh! Moses told God about his worries and doubts, so God told Moses to take his staff and throw it on the ground. When Moses did this, the staff turned into a snake! Moses jumped and was startled! God told Moses to pick up the snake by the tail. When Moses did, the snake turned back into his staff. Then God told Moses to put his hand inside his shirt and take it out. When Moses pulled his hand out, it was covered with a disease called leprosv.

The leprosy made Moses' skin turn white, so he was scared! God then said to put his hand back into his shirt and pull it out again, and his hand was completely healed. God told Moses to use these signs and powers when he talked to the Israelites to prove the true God sent him. But Moses still worried that he could not speak well enough to challenge Pharaoh, so he asked God to send someone else. God told Moses to take his older brother Aaron, who was a good speaker and would help Moses do the talking. God had settled all of Moses's doubts, and Moses was ready to go to Egypt and face Pharaoh!



**Exodus 5:1-21** Moses and Aaron visit Pharaoh. Moses and Aaron went to Egypt to meet with the Israelites and show them the signs. The people believed God had sent Moses! Next, they went to Pharaoh's palace. Pharaoh was the leader of the Egyptians, who did not believe the God of the Israelites was stronger than their gods. Pharaoh forced the Israelites to work hard as Egyptian slaves so that his own people would not have to build his kingdom. But Moses and Aaron told Pharaoh that the God of Israel said, "Let my people go, so that they may hold a festival to worship me in the desert." Pharaoh laughed! He said he did not know the Lord and would not let Israel go.

Pharaoh did not believe in the power of the true God of Israel. Instead, he actually thought he was like a god himself because of his enormous power as Egypt's leader. So Pharaoh told Moses and Aaron to get back to work! Out of anger, he then told his Egyptian officers to make the work much harder for the Israelites, so the Israelites were upset with Moses and Aaron for making Pharaoh mad. But God's plan to free the Israelites was just getting started. With miraculous signs and wonders, God would use Moses and Aaron to bring on events that would change Pharaoh's mind about letting God's people go!





### **Exodus 7:14-24** Moses and the plague of blood.

Pharaoh continued to be stubborn. So God told Moses and Aaron to get up early and go to the Nile River where Pharaoh went every morning. The Nile River was especially important to the Egyptians. They got their drinking, cooking, and bathing water from it for their families, animals, and crops. They dug canals to carry water from the river to everywhere in Egypt. God told Moses to hold his staff, the one that had turned into a snake, over the river so that the water would turn into blood. Moses told Pharaoh that since he did not listen to God, he would prove God had sent him by striking the river with his staff and changing it into blood.

While Pharaoh watched, Moses tapped the Nile with his staff and immediately the water turned into red blood! God's power was on full display as every ounce of water in every stream, lake, pond, and puddle of Egypt turned into blood. Even the water inside buckets turned into blood! The blood also caused an unbearable odor to fill the air, so the Egyptians desperately dug holes in the ground to get clean water. When Pharaoh saw this, he went into his palace and realized that he had never seen anything like this. He was shaken, but his heart was still hard toward Moses and Aaron, and he was not going to let his Israelite slaves go free!







LESSON SETTING: The Israelites felt doomed when Pharaoh's army descended. But God parted the waters of the Red Sea so they could escape. He brought the waters down on Pharaoh's army, proving that it did not matter that Pharaoh's army was stronger than the Israelites, for God was strongest of all.

Soon after the water had turned to blood, God told Moses and Aaron to again go to the river where Pharaoh went in the morning and say, "This is what the Lord says: Let my people go, so that they may worship me. 



Pharaoh was still hard-hearted. He would not let the Israelites go even after many awful plagues devastated the Egyptians, so Moses told Pharaoh that the last plague was going to be the worst. God told Moses He would send a destroyer into Egypt to kill every firstborn son, but would protect the Israelites. He gave Moses specific instructions for each Israelite family to kill a young lamb for dinner and paint the blood of the lamb on the sides and tops of the door frames of their houses. Then during the night, the destroyer would see the blood and pass over that house, not hurting anyone inside. The Israelites did exactly as God said.

At midnight, there was an overwhelming amount of crying throughout all of Egypt as every house, from the Pharaoh's to the poorest, had someone die during the night. But all the Israelites were safe as the blood of the lamb on their door frames saved them. Pharaoh was so sad that his son had died, that he finally agreed to let the Israelites go. God's chosen people were finally going to be free from Egypt. God told Moses and the Israelites to sacrifice a lamb every year and eat it as a special meal that night. During the meal, they were to talk about how God protected them in Egypt. This celebration is called Passover.







While the Israelites were excited to finally be leaving Egypt, Pharaoh and his officials were upset that they had lost their slaves. So Pharaoh assembled his best chariots, fastest horses, and strongest fighters to rush out of Egypt to chase down and bring back the Israelites. The Israelites saw the Egyptian army coming, so in fear they complained that Moses had brought them out to the desert to die! They lost their trust in God to protect them. But God told Moses to lead the people to the Red Sea and to stretch his staff over the sea. God would miraculously divide the water so that the people could cross the sea on dry ground.

As soon as Moses obeyed, the water of the Red Sea parted up on both sides, like walls. The Israelites walked across the Red Sea on the sand of the sea floor. When Pharaoh saw how the Israelites were escaping, he commanded his army to follow them, but as soon as they were getting closer, their chariot wheels began to fall off. When the last Israelite was safe across the Red Sea, Moses raised his staff again and the water went back to how it was, eliminating the path through the sea! The adventures of Elisha the prophet came after Elijah, but Elisha's story is told here first because just as God used his group of prophets to reveal the true God to Israel, God also used Josiah to reveal to Israel the true word of God in the next story. One day, a prophet's wife told Elisha that since she could not pay her bills after her husband died, creditors threatened to take her two boys as slaves. So Elisha sent her to her neighbors' houses to gather empty jars and to pour oil into each one. She poured and poured and the oil did not run out until the last jar! She sold the jars of oil, paid her debts, and her sons were safe.

Later, a rich woman from Shunem invited Elisha to a family meal. The woman knew Elisha was from God, so she decided to make a room on her roof so that Elisha could stay when he came by. Elisha asked what he could do for her, and his helper found out the woman had no son. Elisha told her that within a year she would have a son, and the next year she actually gave birth! Years later, the boy suddenly died, so the woman rode out to see Elisha. ### **Isaiah 53** The future suffering servant (Jesus).

Isaiah was a prophet who told people about Jesus coming to earth 700 years before He actually arrived! This happened when God inspired Isaiah to write about a suffering servant who would die in our place to save us from our sin. This servant would seem like an ordinary man, but He would suffer for the people. So do we know who this servant might be? Joyfully, we know it was Jesus, who suffered and died on the cross for us! Isaiah also let us know this servant would be "pierced for our transgressions (sins)," so do we know who was pierced after His hands and feet were nailed to the cross? It was Jesus. God's Son!

Isaiah wrote more. He added that this servant would be "crushed for our iniquities (sins)" to die for us, and today we know that Jesus died to forgive our sin. He died for us because just as Isaiah spoke of people "like sheep that have gone astray," our Bibles tell us that God sent Jesus as our shepherd to bring us back to Him. Isaiah was used by God to write about the Savior of the world who would die, be buried, and see the "light of life" by rising from the dead! Because of Jesus's death on the cross and then victory over sin and death, we can be forgiven. Thanks to Isaiah, this is something to be thankful about!







# UNIT TEACHER PREP

### **LESSON 1** THE RIGHT CHOICE (1 KINGS 17:1-7)

**LESSON TARGET:** Learn how God cared for Elijah in a dangerous time.

LESSON SETTING: In Israel, King Ahab married a Sidonian princess, Jezebel. Jezebel worshiped Baal, the storm god, so Ahab built a temple to Baal for her. The two also worshiped Asherah, a Canaanite fertility goddess. Jezebel persecuted people who followed God, making it seem that Baal was stronger than God. That confused people. So the Lord sent the prophet Elijah to Ahab to announce a drought, showing the Lord controlled weather, not Baal.

#### LESSON 2

### THE FALLEN CHILD (1 KINGS 17:8-24)

LESSON TARGET: Understand how God raised the widow's son to life through Elijah's prayers.

**LESSON SETTING:** The drought continued for three years, causing devastation and famine. The Lord provided for Elijah's needs miraculously and protected him from Ahab. Remarkably, the Lord sent Elijah to a widow in Sidon, where Jezebel came from. Baal worship was rampant there, but they had no rain.

#### **LESSON 3**

### THE PROCLAMATION (1 KINGS 18:16-39)

**LESSON TARGET:** Understand how Elijah defeated the prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel.


LESSON SETTING: After three years of drought, God told Elijah to summon King Ahab to Mount Carmel. There God proved He was the true God in a spectacular display of power. Once the people present realized who the true God was, Elijah commanded them to kill the Baal prophets, which they did. Then Elijah told Ahab rain was coming. The drought was finally over. 
#### THE PRINCE (ISAIAH 9:6, CHRISTMAS)

**LESSON TARGET:** Understand that Isaiah prophesied a son would to be given who would rule forever.

**LESSON SETTING:** When Isaiah prophesied that God planned to exile Israel and Judah, he also prophesied that God would bring the people back to the land. Then He would send a new king. This king would rule forever in righteousness. After Israel fell, the names *Israelite* and *Jew* were often synonymous. 

I Kings 17:1-7 Elijah receives God's care. Elijah was a prophet whose words came straight from God and out to the people. Much of Elijah's time was spent trying to help the kings of Israel listen to God. Because Israel's third king was disobedient, God split the kingdom of Israel into two kingdoms: Israel and Judah. Some of the kings of Judah were great kings and continued to be obedient to God, but others were evil and worshiped false gods instead of the one true God. All the kings of Israel had been bad kings, for they led the people astray and would not let them worship God in the temple. Elijah continued to plead for the kings and people in Israel to follow the one true God.

God told Elijah that there would not be rain in the land for the next few years. So Elijah told King Ahab, who did not worship the true God and did not like hearing this news. Since Ahab had married a wicked woman who tried to kill everyone who worshiped God, God told Elijah to go and hide in a ravine far away. In the ravine, there was a fresh brook full of clean water to drink, and each day ravens brought Elijah bread and meat both in the morning and at night. During this time, Elijah was safe from King Ahab and under God's care, so he was able to rest and build up his strength to do the mighty work that God had ahead of him.



LESSON SETTING: In Israel, King Ahab married a Sidonian princess, Jezebel. Jezebel worshiped Baal, the storm god, so Ahab built a temple to Baal for her. The two also worshiped Asherah, a Canaanite fertility goddess. Jezebel persecuted people who followed God, making it seem that Baal was stronger than God. That confused people. So the Lord sent the prophet Elijah to Ahab to announce a drought, showing the Lord controlled weather, not Baal.







I Kings 17:8-24 Elijah raises the widow's son. Elijah stayed at the ravine, but then God told Elijah to go to see a widow, whose husband had died, who would feed him. Elijah arrived to find the widow and asked her for some bread. She said she only had enough flour and oil to make one last meal for herself and her son, and then they would be left with no food at all. But Elijah told her not to be afraid. He asked her to make a small cake of bread for him and then for herself and her son. and told her the Lord would not let her oil or flour run out until it rained again! She went home and did as Elijah said, and from then on her flour jar always had enough in it and her oil jug was never empty!

Later, the widow's son became very sick and died. The widow was upset and wondered if she had done something wrong. She remembered how God had used Elijah to save her and her son, so she told Elijah about her son. Elijah, with God's power in him, took the boy from her arms and carried him upstairs. 

I Kings 18 Elijah defeats the prophets of Baal. Ahab was an evil king who taught Israel to worship false gods named Baal and Asherah. Elijah knew he was called to show Israel the true God, so he challenged Ahab to a competition: Elijah and the prophets of Baal would each make an altar to see whose god could send fire from heaven. King Ahab agreed and called 450 of his Baal priests. While the Isralites watched, the Baal priests went first. They built their altar, put bull's meat on it, and prayed—but nothing happened. They danced and cut themselves as an idol ritual, but there was no answer. So Elijah teased them to shout louder and said, "Maybe your god is asleep and must be awakened."

The Baal priests danced and called on their god all morning and afternoon, but by dinnertime Elijah told them to sit. Elijah then dug a deep trench around his altar and had his people pour water over it three times so that it was soaking wet! Then Elijah prayed, "Answer me, O Lord, answer me, so these people will know that you, O Lord, are God, and that you are turning their hearts back again." As soon as he finished praying, fire came roaring down from heaven! In a flash, God answered Elijah with fire that not only burned the altar but also licked up the water in the trench, and Elijah proved to Ahab and all of Israel that there was one true God!




