LESSON 2

ADAM AND EVE DISOBEY GOD (GENESIS 3)






Genesis I God creates the world.






Genesis 2 God creates man.








Genesis 3 Adam and Eve disobey God.

LESSON TARGET: Learn how baby Moses is rescued from a basket among the reeds of a river.

LESSON SETTING: Israel and his huge family moved to Egypt to escape a famine. At first, they did well there. But in time, the Egyptians enslaved them. When their families grow large, Pharaoh orders the midwives to kill all newborn Hebrew boys. The Israelites cry out to God to rescue them. In Exodus 2, Moses's mother puts the newborn Moses in a basket among the reeds in the river. Pharaoh's daughter adopts him and hires Moses's mother to nurse him.

\sim **LESSON 2** THE TWO SPIES (NUMBERS 13–14)

LESSON TARGET: Learn how Moses sends Joshua and Caleb into the promised land as spies.

LESSON SETTING: God calls Moses when he is 80 to lead the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt. Through Moses, God performs many miracles as signs to the Israelites that they can trust Him to take them safely into the promised land. But the people continue to doubt God. In this adventure, they have reached the promised land safely. But when Moses sends twelve spies into the land, ten return and convince the Israelites not to trust God and enter.

LESSON 3

THE LORD SENDS GIDEON (JUDGES 6)

LESSON TARGET: Learn how God calls Gideon to rescue the Israelites from enemies.

LESSON SETTING: Joshua leads the Israelites into the promised land. After him, they have no human ruler. Instead, God is their King. But people quickly forget God's commands and worship idols, doing whatever they think is right in their own eyes. However, when they commit evil in God's eyes, God stops defending them in battles. Then they cry out to God, who sends a deliverer like Gideon. The deliverers-called judges—help people return to God. Unfortunately, soon the cycle repeats.

THE LORD PREPARES GIDEON (JUDGES 7)

LESSON TARGET: Understand why God gives Gideon limited resources to combat the Midianites.

LESSON SETTING: God again gives evidence that the people should trust and obey Him. He calls Gideon to lead warriors into battle. But God wants the people to know He is the reason for their success. So the Lord instructs Gideon to proceed in a way that should not possibly succeed. In fact, Gideon leads 300 men against armies over 100,000 strong. But with God's help, Gideon defeats the armies.

Exodus 2 Moses is born and rescued.

Have you ever wanted to protect someone? Moses' mother wanted to protect her new baby boy, Moses. Moses's family lived in Egypt. The Egyptians took Moses's people as slaves and made them do very hard work. When there were more Israelites than Egyptians, the Egyptian king Pharaoh worried that if there were more Israelites than Egyptians, the Israelites would not work as his slaves anymore. So, the Pharaoh made a cruel law that said all baby Israelite boys should be put to death! Moses's mother was not going to let that happen, and hid Moses in her home as long as she could.

The time came for Gideon to lead an army against the Midianites and the Amalekites, but God told Gideon he had too many soldiers. If their large army was victorious, the Israelites would boast that they beat their enemies without God's help. God wanted them to know he was on their side, so he told Gideon to tell everyone who was afraid to go home. 22,000 men went home, but God told Gideon that his army of 10,000 was still too big. So, God told Gideon to take the men to the water and watch how they drank. Only 300 men cupped their hands to drink, while the rest got on their hands and knees to drink like a dog.

God wanted those who drank like a dog to go home, so Gideon's army shrank from 33,000 to 300 men! One night Gideon took the 300 men to the camps of the enemy armies. At the right time, Gideon and the Israelites blew trumpets and broke big empty jars. The Israelite army was in trouble in their war with the Philistines. Each day, a giant Philistine named Goliath would walk between the armies and yell at the Israelites. King Saul and the Israelite army feared Goliath, who was nine feet tall, wore bronze armor, and was a champion warrior! One day, David's father sent him to the battle with food for his brothers, and the soldiers told him Goliath would challenge someone to fight him and that the victor would decide the battle. David could not believe that they all feared Goliath!

David told Saul he would fight. Saul agreed. David could not walk in Saul's heavy armor, so he removed it and put five smooth stones for his sling in his bag. 






I Samuel 20 David's friendship with Jonathan.

LESSON 1 THE OBEDIENCE (MATTHEW 1:18–24)

LESSON TARGET: Learn how Joseph obeys the angel of the Lord.

LESSON SETTING: Over time, evil kings reject God as their King of kings. So much injustice abounds that people ask God why He allows evil. God explains to prophets that He plans to stop the evil by sending the people into exile and taking away their kings. But the Lord promises to bring them back from exile. And later, He will send an anointed king descended from David who will rule forever in perfect righteousness and justice (Isaiah 9:7).

LESSON 2 THE BIRTH (LUKE 2:1-7)

LESSON TARGET: Learn how the birth of Jesus occurs.

LESSON SETTING: In this adventure, Rome rules. Joseph lives in the town of Nazareth in the province of Galilee. But he and Mary have to go to Bethlehem in the province of Judea for a census. This fulfills prophecy: "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times" (Micah 5:2).

LESSON 3 THE ANGELS (LUKE 2:8–14)

LESSON TARGET: Learn how angels visit the shepherds.

LESSON SETTING: David and all the kings descended from him were called anointed one. That was because they were anointed with oil at their coronation. We get our English word messiah from the Hebrew for anointed one. We get our English word christ from the Greek for anointed one. That is why Jesus is called Messiah and Christ. They are titles that mean Anointed One. Therefore, prophecies about the king who will rule forever are called messianic prophecies.

LESSON 4 THE SHEPHERDS (LUKE 2:15–20, CHRISTMAS)

LESSON TARGET: Learn about the shepherds' trip to Bethlehem.

LESSON SETTING: In Mary's day, people are eager for God to send the Messiah whom the Old Testament prophesies so much about. They think the Messiah will be a warrior who will overthrow Roman rule. Mary is the first to discover this Messiah will be different. He will be the literal Son of God. God sends people to support Mary and Joseph through the pregnancy and birth: Mary's relative Elizabeth, shepherds, two godly prophets at the temple, and wise men.






Matthew I Joseph obeys the angel of the Lord.
