BIBLE SUMMARY

UNIT TERCHER PREP

LESSON 1

SEEKING GOD (ROMANS 15:4; 2 PETER 1:20-21)

LESSON TARGET: Understand that God inspired the Bible.

LESSON SETTING: The Apostle Paul wrote this: "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work" (2 Timothy 3:16–17). Thus, the commands teach us God's ways. The historical books teach us by example. The prophetic books correct and even rebuke us. Psalms teaches us God's character and trains us in how to pray. And Proverbs teach wisdom.



LESSON 2

FINDING GOD (JOHN 8:31-32; 1 PETER 2:2-3)

LESSON TARGET: Learn that Jesus wants us to know His teachings and obey Him.

LESSON SETTING: Jesus said His true disciples hold to His teaching. That means they both know what He teaches and do what He says. Obedience leads to knowing the truth that sets people free. We can journey through life the easy way or the hard way. The easy way is to hold to Jesus' teaching. But the hard way is to suffer the consequences of not doing so: conflict, broken relationships, and unhappiness.



LESSON 3

KNOWING GOD (PSALM 5:1-3; JOHN 15:5-8)

LESSON TARGET: Understand that knowing and obeying Jesus changes us for the good.

LESSON SETTING: Just as a grapevine must stay attached to the vine's trunk to bear grapes, so people must stay attached to Jesus to bear spiritual fruit. Spiritual fruit glorifies the Father and shows people we are truly Jesus' disciples. Spiritual fruit includes character traits such as love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Galatians 5:22–23). It also includes ministry such as helping others and sharing the gospel. When we pray for fruit, God loves to answer.



LESSON 4

HONORING GOD (ISAIAH 55:10-11; PSALM 19:7-8)

LESSON TARGET: Know that following God's ways will make us wise and happy.


LESSON SETTING: Psalms and Proverbs proclaim how wonderful God's commands are. They make the simple person wise. All of us start as simple children, but God's commands make us wise when we embrace and follow them. As we do, we see what good they bring to our lives, and that gives us joy. We also see what happens to those who reject God's way, and that makes us even happier that we chose the path of wisdom.










2 Pet. 1:20-21; Rom. 15:4 The origin of the Bible.

Where did the Bible come from? The Bible itself gives us the answer, starting with key verses written by two apostles named Peter and Paul. While Peter was in a Roman prison, arrested for spreading the news of Jesus, he wrote a letter to Christ followers that is called 2nd Peter in our Bible today. In the first chapter, Peter said that none of the prophets or writers of the Bible wrote down their own thoughts, but rather, "spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit." This tells us that God chose the Bible's writers such as Peter and Paul, and that He used the Holy Spirit to help them write His perfect message.

Paul wrote a letter to the believers in Rome that is called Romans in our Bible today. In chapter 15, Paul said "Everything that was written in the past," like the book of Genesis, "was written to teach us." He also said that "through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope." So when we put Peter and Paul's verses together, we see that God chose people to be filled with the Spirit and to write His Words to teach and encourage us. This is why we call the Bible God's Word, and why we get to know Him better when we read it. So, the Bible came from God for us to know Him and His plan for our lives.








THE BLUEPRINT








I Pet. 2:2-3; Jn. 8:31-32 The purpose of the Bible.

What does the Bible do for us? Again, the Bible itself gives us the answer, starting with key verses written by two apostles named Peter and John. Peter wrote a letter to new believers in Christ that is called 1st Peter in our Bible today. In the 2nd chapter, Peter spoke to them as "newborn babies" when he encouraged them to "crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation." Peter was happy that they had now tasted the goodness of the Lord, but he also knew that their faith would be tested and needed to become even stronger by studying God's Word. So, the Bible helps us to grow in our faith.

Like Peter, John was one of Jesus' disciples, and the Holy Spirit guided him to write the gospel of John. In the 8th chapter, John taught us that the Bible teaches us the truth when he wrote, "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." We know the truth that God is all-powerful and is always with us, and we know the truth that God saved us from our sin through sacrificing His Son. Holding on to these truths frees us from sin, the lies of the world, and separation from God. Simply, the Bible helps us to grow in our faith by knowing God's truth.





Ps. 5:1-3: Jn. 15:5-8 The value of the Bible.

Israel had a revival under Elijah and Elisha, but over time the Why do we need the Bible? Simply put, to stay connected to God. All of us have seen a pretty flower in a vase. With water, the flower stays pretty for a short time, but eventually dies because it is no longer attached to the plant. In the same way, both David the Psalmist and the Apostle John wrote about staying attached to God by seeking His holy Word. In his 5th Psalm, David wrote, "In the morning, O Lord, you hear my voice; I lay my requests before you and wait in expectation." This confirms that God hears us, and that we in turn have a desire for God to answer us. So, we need God's Word to help keep us close to Him.

Then, in the 15th chapter of John's gospel, he wrote these important words of Jesus: "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit." Jesus was telling both His disciples and us today that we are to "remain" in Him, which means to be a part of Him, to stay close and connected to Him, and to obey Him. The words of the Bible actually help us to obey His commands! In fact, Jesus said "If you obey my commands, you will remain in my love." So when we obey Jesus, we bear fruit and become more like Him. So, the Bible helps us stay close to God and remain in Jesus.


CHANGED BY THE BOOK










Ps. 19:7-8: Is. 55:10-11 The Bible's handiwork.

How does the Bible work? In a word: perfectly. Though everyone has been promised something they didn't receive, God has never promised anything He didn't deliver. Knowing this truth, both David the Psalmist and the Prophet Isaiah wrote about how God's Word accomplishes everything He desires. In the 19th Psalm, David wrote, "The precepts of the Lord are right, giving joy to the heart. The commands of the Lord are radiant, giving light to the eyes." This means that God—who is the same today, yesterday, and tomorrow—gives joy to our hearts and light to our eyes through his Word. Because the words come from God, the Bible works to give us joy and light.

Similarly, Isaiah described in his book of prophecy how the words of the Bible go forth to do the work of God. In the 55th chapter, he wrote, "As the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return to it without watering the earth, so is my word that goes out from my mouth: It will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it." Wow! This means that whatever God speaks happens! And since He created us, He knows what is best for us. So, the Bible works to give us joy and light, and to achieve God's purpose in our lives! With only His Word—God created the earth, and he can certainly change our lives!



UNIT TERCHER PREP

LESSON 1 HIS CALL (LUKE 5:1–11)

LESSON TARGET: Learn how Jesus called Simon Peter to be His disciple.

LESSON SETTING: While Jesus was at Simon's house, Jesus healed many people and cast out demons. The demons shouted, "You are the Son of God!" (Luke 4:41). They knew Jesus was the Christ—that is, Messiah—the anointed king the Jews awaited. People did not expect the Messiah to be literally the Son of God because all kings descended from David held the title "son of God" (2 Samuel 7:14). LESSON 2 HIS CAUTION (LUKE 14:7–11)

LESSON TARGET: Understand why Jesus told a parable about a wedding feast.

LESSON SETTING: A Pharisee invites Jesus to a meal at his home after a synagogue service. The Pharisees were a religious sect made up of mostly businessmen. They shared political power with the Sadducees, a sect of mostly priests. The Pharisees followed many oral traditions that they believed provided a hedge around the law. Jesus called their rules "traditions of men" (Mark 7:8). Jesus' parable is based on Proverbs 25:6–7, which the Pharisees should have known.



LESSON 3

HIS COMMAND (JOHN 3:1-7)

LESSON TARGET: Know what it means to be born again.

LESSON SETTING: When Nicodemus notes that Jesus is "able" to perform miracles, Jesus replies that no one is "able" to enter God's kingdom unless they are born again. Jesus expands on this prophecy: "I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you will be clean; I will cleanse you from all your impurities and from all your idols. I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you" (Ezekiel 36:25–26).

HIS CURE (JOHN 4:46–54)

LESSON TARGET: Learn how Jesus healed the official's son from afar.


LESSON SETTING: Cana was in Galilee. Galilee was the Roman district where Jesus lived. Jews traveled to the temple in the district of Judea three times a year for festivals. In this narrative, the Galileans welcome Jesus because they want to see more signs like those He gave at the temple not long before. They seek neither His teaching nor His person, but only His power. Yet Jesus had already provided enough evidence that God sent Him, so their weak faith disappoints Him.







Luke 5 Jesus calls His disciples.

One day, there were so many people listening to Jesus teach that it became too crowded for all of the people to hear Him. So Jesus asked one of the local fishermen, named Simon Peter, if He could stand in his boat to teach so that the people could hear His message. Simon said yes. After Jesus had finished teaching, He asked Simon to put the boat out into the lake. As they were rowing, Jesus told Simon to put the nets out since in Bible times they used nets to catch fish at night. Simon had already been fishing all night and had not caught anything, but he knew Jesus was a special passenger and so he put his nets back into the lake.

Once the nets were in the water, so many fish swam into the nets that they almost broke! Simon Peter was worried about the nets breaking, so he called out to his friends in a nearby boat to help. When they pulled in the nets, so many fish filled both boats that they started to sink! Simon could not believe that after not catching one fish before, he had two boats full of hundreds of fish. He instantly became a disciple and helped spread the word that Jesus was the true Son of God!










Luke 14 The wedding feast parable.

Jesus went to an important person's house for dinner after a synagogue service. The important person was part of a group of Pharisees who were so serious about following God's rules that they even made up rules of their own! The Pharisees also thought they were the only ones who followed God's rules the right way. Because of this, they had become very prideful and were constantly treating others as if they were better than them. Jesus noticed that the Pharisees were taking all the best seats at the dinner. So He told a parable, which is an earthly story that reveals a heavenly truth about God, to the people attending the dinner.

Jesus told the story of a person going to a special event, like a wedding, who should not sit in the best seat in the house since there might be someone more important for whom the seat is reserved. If that were to happen, this person would have to give up their seat and be embarrassed. Instead, this person should sit in the lower seat and be invited to sit in a better place and be honored. Jesus used the story to teach the Pharisees to be humble and realize they were sinners in need of forgiveness. He reminded us that those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.







John 3 Jesus and Nicodemus.

Nicodemus was a Pharisee who had been listening to Jesus. He thought Jesus was from God because He performed miracles and healed people, and wondered how anyone could do this if God were not with him. So Nicodemus went to talk with Jesus at night. He did this so the other Pharisees would not know. He told Jesus he knew He was a great teacher from God, but Jesus told Nicodemus he would not see the kingdom of God or heaven unless he was born again. Nicodemus was confused. What did Jesus mean? He knew he could not enter his mother's womb, so he asked Jesus how he could be born again.

Jesus answered, "I tell you the truth, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless he is born of water and the Spirit." Jesus went on to explain that being born again is like becoming a new person whose sin is washed away and who is filled with God's Spirit! When we are born again, we are no longer enemies of God, but rather new members of His family! Jesus then told Nicodemus, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." We are born again by our faith in Jesus, and in this second birth we are born of God for all eternity!

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



BIBLE SUMMARY

Jesus in His final ministry week shows that He is the Messiah. He is the Passover lamb whose blood frees people from slavery to sin so they can live (1 Corinthians 5:7). He is the suffering servant of Isaiah 53. And He is the firstfruits of the resurrected (1 Corinthians 15:20).



UNIT TERCHER PREP

LESSON 1

HIS RIDE (MARK 11:1–11)

LESSON TARGET: Learn that Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a colt to fulfill prophecy.

LESSON SETTING: In the triumphal entry, Jesus rides into Jerusalem on a donkey colt to fulfill prophecy: "Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey" (Zechariah 9:9). The people believe Jesus is the Messiah (anointed king), so they quote Psalm 118:25–26, a messianic psalm. But everyone misses the significance that He enters on the day the Jews select the Passover lambs to sacrifice.



LESSON 2 HIS REMINDER (MARK 14:12–26)

LESSON TARGET: Understand that Jesus initiated God's promised new covenant at the Last Supper.

LESSON SETTING: The prophets had foretold that God would exile both Israel and Judah because the people broke their covenant with Him. But Jeremiah 22:31 prophesied that after the people returned from exile, God would make a new covenant with people. In this narrative, Jesus fulfills that prophecy by initiating a new covenant during the Passover feast.



LESSON 3

HIS REDEMPTION (MATTHEW 27:32–54)

LESSON TARGET: Learn that the Passover lambs pointed to Jesus' crucifixion.

LESSON SETTING: Jews count days from sunset to sunset. So, on the same Jewish day as the Passover meal, Jewish leaders arrest and deliver Jesus to the governor for crucifixion. His blood drips, for Jesus is the Passover lamb and the pierced suffering servant. The governor knows Jesus is innocent. So, on the placard that should describe Jesus' crime, he writes, "King of the Jews," unaware of its truth. On the cross, Jesus quotes Psalm 22:1, for the psalm foreshadows the day's events.






Mark II Jesus rides into Jerusalem.

It was time for Jesus to complete His work on earth as He and His disciples headed into Jerusalem to celebrate Passover. Jesus told His disciples to go into a nearby village and look for a donkey colt tied to a pole, and to bring it to Him so He could ride it into Jerusalem. Jesus told them to say, "The Lord needs it and will send it back here shortly" if anyone questioned them. The disciples did just as Jesus said. They brought the colt and its mother to Him and put their coats on the donkeys. As Jesus rode in on the colt, people laid their coats on the ground in front of Him. They also laid palm branches on the ground to honor Jesus.

The people were excited to see Jesus coming into the city and shouted, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" Hosanna means "God, save us." As Jesus entered the city, He fulfilled the prophecy that Zechariah wrote about a special king who would ride in on a donkey colt that had never been ridden. The people thought Jesus was coming to be their earthly king, so this upset the Jewish leaders who were already jealous of the attention Jesus was receiving. So they met together to decide how to stop Him, but Jesus overcame their efforts because He was sent to save us from our sins.










Mark 14 Jesus and the Last Supper.

Jesus sent some of His disciples ahead to get the Passover meal ready for them to eat. He told them to follow a man who was carrying a jug of water and ask him where the room was for them to eat the meal. When the disciples went and followed the man with the jug of water, he took them to a house whose owner led them to a large upstairs room. During the meal, Jesus said some very important things to His disciples. As He passed out the bread, He said, "Take it; this is my body." Jesus used the bread to show His disciples that just like the bread was broken for them to eat, so His body would be broken on the cross.

Then as they drank the wine, Jesus said, "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many." This showed Jesus' disciples that His blood was going to be shed. The disciples did not understand that Jesus meant His body would be broken and His blood would be shed on the cross when He went to die for our sins. He also said this would be the last time He drank of the vine until He was in the kingdom of God. That is why this is called the Last Supper. After the meal was over, Jesus and some of the disciples went to a garden to pray. Jesus knew it was time to fulfill His mission and go to the cross.








Matthew 27 Jesus is crucified.

The time had come for our Savior to accomplish His work. After the Passover meal, Jesus was arrested, mocked, and punished by the Roman soldiers. Though sinless, He was sentenced to be crucified on a cross. The soldiers guarded Jesus and put a sign above His head that said, "King of the Jews." Then they played a game with dice to see who would keep Jesus' clothes, and called Him names as other people came to watch Jesus on the cross. The Jewish leaders shouted that if He were really God's Son, He would be able to come down from the cross, but they didn't know it was God's will for Jesus to die.

At about noon, it grew very dark. Three hours later, Jesus called out in a loud voice, "My God! My God! Why have you forsaken me?" But He was willing to suffer and die for us so that we could have eternal life. He then cried out in a loud voice and died. Immediately there was a huge earthquake, and the curtain in the temple was torn in half, showing that now nothing can separate us from God. When the centurion and the guards saw the earthquake and all that had happened, they were terrified, and exclaimed, "Surely he was the Son of God!" BIBLE PASSAGE

One of the exciting things that happen when people turn to Jesus in faith is that the Holy Spirit enters them.

Then He works from within them so that they develop spiritual fruit. Fruit includes godly character traits and ministry, such as sharing the gospel.



UNIT TERCHER PREP

LESSON 1

FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT (GALATIANS 5:22-23)

LESSON TARGET: Understand that all of us have sinned, but the Holy Spirit changes us.

LESSON SETTING: Jesus pours His Holy Spirit onto His followers during another festival, the Feast of Weeks, also known as Pentecost. The Holy Spirit is God, just as Jesus and the Father are God: three Persons, one God. People are born spiritually dead (Ephesians 2:1–3). But when we turn to Jesus in faith, the Holy Spirit enters us and makes us spiritually alive so we have eternal life (Ephesians 2:4–5; Romans 8:10). The Holy Spirit produces fruit in people.



LESSON 2

FRUIT FROM GOD (1 CORINTHIANS 13:1-13)

LESSON TARGET: Know that the Holy Spirit will grow love, joy and peace in us.

LESSON SETTING: The Bible defines love as actions and attitudes that seek good for others: "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs" (1 Corinthians 13:4–5). We receive peace with God when we turn to Jesus, but the Holy Spirit grows inner peace and joy in us as we mature in Christ.



LESSON 3

FRUIT FOR OTHERS (EPHESIANS 4:25-32)

LESSON TARGET: Know that the Holy Spirit will help us be patient, kind, and good to others.

LESSON SETTING: Patience, kindness, and goodness do not come naturally. They are traits parents try to teach children. The Holy Spirit goes farther in that He cares not just about our actions, but also about our thoughts. He convicts us when our thoughts are impatient, unkind, or not good. We can then confess the thought immediately, accept forgiveness, and change our actions. We can also apologize to anyone with whom we have been impatient or unkind.



LESSON 4

FRUIT TO LIVE BY (2 TIMOTHY 2:22-26)

LESSON TARGET: Learn that faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control are important traits.


LESSON SETTING: Faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control are more traits that do not come naturally. Faithfulness toward God matters when we meet people who do not like Christianity. Jesus warned that when that happens, we must be faithful and not deny Him (Matthew 10:32–33). Gentleness is particularly helpful when someone is angry with us: "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger." (Proverbs 15:1). And we need self-control when we face this world's many temptations.








Galatians 5 The fruit of the Spirit.

After Jesus rose, He appeared to His disciples and spent many days with them. In fact, over 500 followers saw Jesus alive after He had been crucified! Then, before Jesus ascended into heaven, He promised His disciples they would receive power when the Holy Spirit came upon them. So with the help of the Holy Spirit, the disciples became Jesus' witnesses as the early church began to grow. The Holy Spirit also inspired the apostle Paul—one of the earliest apostles to travel widely to spread the news of Jesus' death and resurrection—to write a letter to the Jewish Christians in Galatia, which became the book of the Bible we call Galatians!

In the 5th chapter of Galatians, Paul wrote about the nine qualities the Holy Spirit produces in Christians called the "Fruit of the Spirit." Paul taught that just as a tree blossoms and produces healthy fruit, so a Christ follower blossoms and produces spiritual fruit—which is the evidence of Christ in them. This fruit that should be on display in Christians includes love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. These qualities show people the Holy Spirit in us. When we walk in step with the Spirit, we produce fruit that imitates Jesus. And don't forget: the Spirit's fruit is fully on display ... when we walk His way!

LESSON SETTING: Jesus pours His Holy Spirit onto His followers during another festival, the Feast of Weeks, also known as Pentecost. The Holy Spirit is God, just as Jesus and the Father are God: three Persons, one God. People are born spiritually dead (Ephesians 2:1–3). But when we turn to Jesus in faith, the Holy Spirit enters us and makes us spiritually alive so we have eternal life (Ephesians 2:4–5; Romans 8:10). The Holy Spirit produces fruit in people.








I Corinthians 13 The greatest of these is love.

The first three fruits: love, joy, and peace—begin with love. The Apostle Paul wrote 1 Corinthians to believers who needed to mature in their faith. He introduced spiritual gifts in chapter twelve, but then in chapter thirteen wrote that it was useless to have these gifts if we didn't have love. Paul then defined love: It is patient and kind, and does not envy, boast, or become proud. Simply put, it seeks to love others more than ourselves, and the Holy Spirit helps us to do this. This Christ-like love does not dishonor others and is not self-seeking, is not easily angered, keeps no record of wrongs, and does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth.

Once we understand that genuine love from the Holy Spirit always protects, trusts, hopes, perseveres, and never fails, we should be filled with joy knowing that Jesus has promised eternal life to those who believe in Him. In this way, having joy is more than being happy, since happiness comes and goes. Rather, joy from the Holy Spirit gives us the confidence we need to trust God even in hard times, since we know that heaven awaits! And finally, peace from the Holy Spirit means peace with God. Because of Jesus' victory on the cross, our sin no longer separates us from God, and this gives us peace in a weary world.






Ephesians 4 Building others up.

The Spirit's fruit that lives in believers to bless others is patience, kindness, and goodness. In fact, the Apostle Paul wrote about this fruit in the fourth chapter of Ephesians. To prepare Christians for their walk with God and relationships with each other, Paul wrote, "Speak truthfully to each other since we are members of one body." He also said to not let our anger give the devil an opportunity, to put away sin, and to say only what builds others up. Finally, he stressed getting rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, and to "be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

These words from Paul mirror the fruit of patience, kindness, and goodness. We show patience when we don't get upset about not getting what we want. The Spirit helps us to be patient with each other, just as God was patient with us while we were still sinners. We show kindness when we think of others' needs before our own, and when we forgive each other, even if it is not deserved, just as Christ forgave us. We show goodness not by avoiding trouble, but by expressing encouraging words or deeds to build each other up. Our goodness toward each other should come from our love for God, who has certainly been good to us!










2 Timothy 2 A pure heart.

The Spirit's fruit that believers must strive to live by is faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Why are these important? The Apostle Paul knew. In his second letter to Timothy, he urged Timothy from prison in Rome for the believers to imitate Christ by being kind and gentle with their enemies, not resentful of them. As they were persecuted, he wrote that all who call on the Lord out of a pure heart must "Flee the evil desires of youth and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace." They must avoid foolish arguments and gently instruct those who oppose them "in the hope that God will grant them repentance leading them to a knowledge of the truth."

This letter from Paul to Timothy shows the importance of faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Faithfulness enables us to be true to God even when it is not popular to do so. When we are faithful to God, the Holy Spirit enables us to teach His Word with no compromise. Gentleness is needed when we speak truth to others without insulting them or speaking out of anger. This is especially important when we are speaking to non-believers about the love of Christ, which is where self-control comes in. Self-control from the Holy Spirit helps us stay out of guarrels and prevents us from making bad choices that stain our identity in Christ. This is walking with the Spirit!

LESSON SETTING: Faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control are more traits that do not come naturally. Faithfulness toward God matters when we meet people who do not like Christianity. Jesus warned that when that happens, we must be faithful and not deny Him (Matthew 10:32-33). Gentleness is particularly helpful when someone is angry with us: "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger." (Proverbs 15:1). And we need self-control when we face this world's many temptations.

FRUIT TO LIVE BY

After reviewing the Bible passage in 2 Timothy 2:22-26, direct the students to think about the passage and then answer the questions using a complete sentence. Have the students discuss their answers.

ANSWER IDEAS

- 1. According to 2 Timothy 2:22, how should we call on the Lord?
- According to 2 Timothy 2:22, we should call on the Lord out of a pure heart.
- 2. God is faithful to us. As the seventh fruit of the Spirit, how can we be a faithful person whom others can
- We can be faithful by keeping promises to God or a friend who is counting on us.
- 3. As the eighth fruit of the Spirit, how can we be gentle? We can be gentle by not overreacting or seeking revenge with others.
- 4. As the ninth fruit of the Spirit, how can we show self-control even when we have been treated unfairly? We can have self-control by following the example of Jesus, who had compassion even for those who treated Him unfairly.

Jesus went to the cross and displayed faithfulness (He obeyed God and accepted His mission), gentleness (He did not speak a word or retaliate against His enemies), and self-control (He remained calm as He was persecuted).


